Are you making an online application?		Supporting documentation must arrive in the CAO within 10 days of registering an online application e.g. copies of qualifications <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ⓢ Put CAO number on the top of each piece of paper you are sending to CAO
All applicants must supply a valid email address, as CAO may need to email you urgently about your application. You will need to check your email inbox regularly.		
If you are applying from within the Republic of Ireland, you can pay the fee at a bank using an <i>Application Fee Payment Form</i> . This form can be obtained by contacting CAO and requesting it to be posted to you. This must be done well in advance of closing dates. Are you making an application based on QQI (FETAC) results? Late applications after February 1 st		It might be possible to make a late application up to May 1 st Check with the admissions office of the college(s). There is an additional charge (application fee - €60 - online or €90 by paper)
Have you made a late application?		You will need to contact the Admissions Officer(s) of the colleges you have applied to, stating you have made a late application - in order to request attendance at early/ first round assessments. <i>(Please note IT Carlow only call mature applicants that apply before Feb 1st for interview. Late applicants will therefore be assessed on their CAO application only.)</i>
Did you make a paper application after February 1 st but before May 1 st ? You should have received your Statement of Course Choices by mid- May		If you have not received this statement by mid-May you will need to contact CAO
Do you need to amend your application?		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ⓢ Closing date for online change of course choices is 5pm, 31st January (free) Ⓢ Online facility to amend course choices is available from 4th February until 1st March (fee of €10)
Change of mind facility		<p>Available from 5th May @ 12pm - July 1st @ 5pm. Exceptions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ⓢ No restricted courses can be added. Ⓢ Colleges may not allow mature students add in new course choices at this stage - applicants will need to check with individual Admissions office.

Change in personal information		You may change your personal details (apart from your name and date of birth) by logging in to your account. To change your name and/or date of birth you must make a request to CAO in writing. Once approved, it may take up to five working days to be updated.
If you are applying for courses in IT Carlow you might be eligible for the Carlow Access Programme. This is separate to your CAO application. You must apply by 1 st March directly to IT Carlow.		Further information and application forms are available on the IT Carlow website - www.itcarlow.ie

- Ⓢ **Late applications** = applications made after February 1st but before May 1st
- Ⓢ **Restricted courses** = these are courses that usually have early assessment procedures (e.g. aptitude tests/ interviews/ portfolio submissions)
- Ⓢ **Supplementary form** = an additional form

You can carry out this research on the Student Finance website (www.studentfinance.ie), Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI - www.susi.ie) and directly with the college(s) you have applied to. Certain programmes/ schemes might have early application deadlines e.g. Access Programmes.
